Wednesday, June 8, at 11:00 a.m.

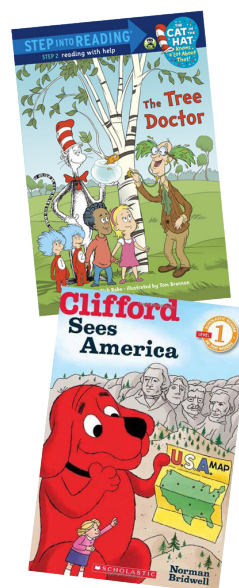
